Interns were able to gain invaluable mentorship from their supervisors, receive income during their placement, enrich their work experience and get the chance to build essential skills. Intern hosts, likewise, were generally very appreciative of contributions made by interns to their organizations.

A significant number of interns was of visible minorities and women.

About 1 in 4 of interns assisted their IHO's with website/mobile development and (re)design from scratch.

Interns working directly with IHO clients provided a great deal of support to people dealing with poverty, mental and health disabilities, trauma, socio-economic and employment barriers, low ICT and ESL literacy – helping to fulfill the mandate of their respective IHO's.

From the testimonies from youth interns, it is glaringly apparent that the program is vital for students, young graduates, or those who are looking to break into the IT field. So many youth have attributed their success to the placements provided by this program.

Last cycle, about 1 in 4 interns continued on as paid employees with their IHO's or were hired as contractors with other organizations related to their fields of interest immediately after the internship.

VCN also hired on youth interns to do contractual work on special projects, but was unable to retain them due to lack of funds.

It would be beneficial to secure a multi-year contract that would improve with retention for the administrative team and prevent staff turn-over. When this occurs each cycle, it seriously disrupts VCN's work, as it requires resources and time to train new staff.

The Youth Intern supports our clients with these issues, and by doing so, other staff can focus on their job descriptions, knowing that clients are being supported. Many people who use our computers, and get support from our Youth Intern eventually become clients of other staff, so the intern is an introduction to our organization in many ways. Community: there are very few free public computers that people can use in our rural and remote community. The other 2 organizations that offer free computer use do not provide computer support to the people using them. We find that people who are living in poverty, with disabilities, and low literacy skills, as well as seniors need, not only access to computers and the internet, but support with using them. The assumption from the government seems to be that everyone has access to computers and knows how to use them, which is not the case. With applications to government services moving online, and communication being increasingly based online, the computer site, along with the youth intern provides our community with the crucial services they need in order to avoid falling through the cracks. The digital divide seems to get bigger without services and programs such as these. I think it is really important to recognize the importance of someone providing support with what many people consider basic skills: how to navigate the internet, set up a Facebook account (safely and with appropriate privacy settings), set up an email account and use it, understand online safety and privacy.

The fact that the computer site is a small part of the work our organization does, means that youth interns are exposed to a greater not-for profit environment, social issues, and opportunities. I know that our youth interns over the years have valued the experiences they acquired and it has impacted decisions they make later on in life. The work also has helped them access other employment opportunities because of the "related work experience" they gained through the CAP Youth Intern program.

Many of the people who use our computer site require assistance, putting the additional task on other staff who support people on the computer off the side of their desks.

Yes. As I mentioned before, the assumption that people have access to computers and that people know how to use computers/navigate the internet is putting a lot of people at risk because they cannot access government applications, apply for employment opportunities, stay connected with family and friends, access information, etc. In a rural and remote community like ours, there are no government service agencies that can provide people with one on one support, instead they are directed online, but if they don't have access to a computer, or know how to navigate the internet, they are at a major disadvantage. Personally, I have worked with so many people who don't have email addresses, know how to do simple searches online, type, etc. I think that it was

very sad that the CAP program was no longer available, but that it could continue to be provided in many different ways (not specifically how it was delivered originally).

 What would be the impact if the Youth Internship Program was not offered by the former Industry Canada, now Innovation, Science and Economic Development in 2015-2016?

Again, many of our clients would not get support online/on computers, leaving them at risk of falling between the cracks. Youth Interns provide vital, and basic support to individuals that are at risk and often marginalized: people with disabilities, people with low literacy skills, seniors, people fleeing violence, people living in poverty, immigrants, etc.
